ONE ACTIVISTS JOURNEY TO SUCCESS

The Grassroots Leadership Academy team conducted a transformative training session in Dayton, OH, where a group of determined citizens came together to learn how to make real change in their communities. The future of Education was at the top of their list of concerns, particularly as they grappled with the ongoing 130-school district lawsuit against private school vouchers in Ohio.

Throughout the training, attendees learned the art of building a movement, recruiting volunteers, and honing their message to effect change. The topic of testifying was particularly inspiring, as participants practiced incorporating their personal stories into their testimony; learning how to speak from the heart. One participant, Jeremy, stood out with his passionate argument against the unfairness of the lawsuit to parents and teachers in his community, Xenia.

With the support and guidance of his peers, Jeremy refined his testimony and even had the opportunity to present it before the entire class. And thanks to the skills and confidence he gained during the GLA training, Jeremy was able to deliver his testimony with conviction and impact in front of the school board. In the end, Jeremy's community's school district pulled out of the lawsuit and is a powerful example of how one person's voice, when amplified through the power of community, can create real and lasting change.

UNLEASHING CHANGE AT EIGHTY

For 30 years, Jerry Rutherford diligently attended school board meetings in Naples, Florida, all the while homeschooling his daughters with his wife Jeanene. However, it wasn't until he and Jeanene attended a GLA Advocate Certification series in Estero, FL, led by Engagement Director Roxanne Buckels, that Jerry discovered his true calling.

A defining moment of the training was the storytelling session, where Jerry learned to narrate his ideas in a way that would motivate others to rally behind him. Armed with these powerful communication techniques, Jerry knew it was time to act. He courageously decided to run for school board and, buoyed by a persuasive story and a coalition of like-minded supporters, Jerry emerged victorious with 65.4% of the vote.

Jerry's experience illustrates the power of grassroots training and emphasizes that it's never too late to make a meaningful impact. Despite his age of 80, he demonstrated that through sheer determination and perseverance, one can overcome any obstacle and effect real change. John Giancola is a grassroots leader in Jefferson County Missouri. As a Grassroots Leadership Academy graduate, he has demonstrated a passion for moving knowledge into action that has led him to mobilize and organize a group of other GLA trained advocates in his community. He led this group in an effort to defeat a massive sales tax increase in their county. They won the tax fight 75-25% (when most local tax measures passed in other places throughout the state). This tax would have added 3/8ths cent increase to sales tax to increase the parks department budget by nearly 400%. John is a true grassroots leader in his state and he utilized his training to accomplish a victory for his community.

During a 2022 training in Missouri, he said "Getting leaders trained so that we can train other leaders to grow our group so that we can be more effective when we work on campaign setup strategies. All those things that takes people, and it takes people leading people. The idea of mentorship and discipleship, creating new members, new leaders, new people to participate. Not people who sit in seats, but people willing to participate that's what I have learned from the Grassroots Leaders Certification."

The Western GLA team began 2022 with a clear focus: to identify and train grassroots leaders. We got off to a strong start by partnering with team Alaska to host a series of weekend boot camps in Anchorage, which attracted nearly 200 volunteers, many of whom were new to our community. The enthusiasm generated by these events helped inspire our region to bring together 120 of our top community leaders and staff for the inaugural Western Leaders Summit. Attendees learned vital skills and policy knowledge from AFPF state directors, GLA trainers, and policy experts, which helped boost leaders' ability to make change in their communities.

In addition to our core grassroots training with AFPF offices, our team used their individual passions and gifts to reach new audiences. Cait Oponski-Luca, our resident cowgirl, worked to expand our reach beyond the city limits by organizing training events with rural, entrepreneurial women, and has big plans to bring our presence to the rodeo markets.

To break down barriers across all communities, our newest trainer, LaNiqua McCloud, created a coalition of leaders in the Las Vegas market under a project she refers to as the Black Renaissance. Kiran Hill, relying on his extensive military service as an intelligence officer in the Marines, defense contractor, and interpreter, continued to explain US foreign policy in layman's terms to audiences across the nation.

Looking ahead to 2023, our team is eager to continue our efforts working with grassroots leaders, growing our reach to new audiences, and educating the public on previous policy wins they may not be aware of via a new project code-named "It's Working." None of this would have been possible without the support of our generous donors, AFPF state partners, and the excellent team of employees at GLA.

Western Leaders Summit

UNITING ACTIVISTS IN THE CO. ROCKIES

A highlight of the 2022 Grassroots
Leadership Academy training year was the
Western Leaders Summit held in Colorado
Springs. The event brought together some of
the top advocates from several Western
states and provided them with the
opportunity to share their stories more
effectively using social media. A total of 120
citizens were hand-selected by AFPF state
partners and sponsored by AFP Foundation
which provided individual scholarships for
them to attend. Additionally, the GLA was
able to invite several teenage advocates from
Texas to participate in the summit who had
previously attended a GLA training.

During the training, participants honed their communication skills to more effectively promote change across their state, federal, and local communities. The attendees were able to come together and share their success stories, inspire one another to hold their respective state governments accountable, and build community.

The Grassroots Leadership Academy had the opportunity to host a Storytelling workshop for 65 female small business owners in Washington as a business-to-business partnership. 
